Student Violates Creston School District Policy, Classroom Expectations or Violates the Law EXCEPTIONAL MISCONDUCT ORDINARY MISCONDUCT Behavior that is cause for removal from school, requires referral to Law Behavior that is cause for concern, requires corrective action, or Enforcement, or is persistent and disruptive to the educational process. is or is momentary and disruptive to the educational process. **Grievous/Significant** Common/Typical **STEP 1 INTERVENTION** (DOES NOT pose an immediate (Poses immediate threat and/or Student Conference – REQUIRED; Consequence (detention, persistent disruption to the threat and/or persistent disruption etc.) - SUGGESTED; Parent Contact - SUGGESTED; education process) to the education process) Documentation - SUGGESTED. **MAINTAIN in CLASS** STEP 2 INTERVENTION Student Conference – REQUIRED; Consequence (detention, Teacher's discretion to determine if the situation is emergent or may etc. - REQUIRED; Parent Contact - REQUIRED; escalate. If not, refer later. 


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Student Behavior Management and Disciplinary Due Process When Dr. Wadlington is Unavailable
